



























Issues with the old theme and how they might get solved



What was wrong with the old theme?

- Underscores based, but 4 year old code
- Usage of "deprecated" HTML tags and attributes (a11y)
- Very bad keyboard accessibilty
- Only one navigation possible
- Limited widget areas (some special ones on the front page)
- No special page templates for typical WordCamp pages





- Just write a child theme
- Or upload your own custom theme
- Install some plugin for additional functionality
- Add some JavaScript to improve menu accessibitily

• Easy, right?





- A large multisite, hosting all WordCamp websites
- Only Superadmin can install themes and plugins
- Administators can't use any JavaScript
- They can't even use SVG images



Who to customize a WordCamp theme?


- Using the customizer
- Using shortcodes from the WordCamp.org platform
- Using a remote CSS file (ideally a public Git repository)
- Using the installed plugins (mainly Jetpack and some Post-Types)



The old theme

- Two additional widget areas after the header: after-header and after-headerhomepage (only on the front_page)
- Two additional widget before the content: before-content and beforecontent-homepage (only on the front_page)
- A second sidebar: sidebar-2
- 5 footer widget areas: footer-widget-1 ... footer-widget-5
- A credit action in the footer (which was never really used)

The new theme

- Latest version of _s for a solid HTML structure and good a11y
- Provide more flexibility by providing layout option, page templates and more widget areas
- Provide modular CSS and a style guide
- More flexible homepage options
- Page templates for speakers, sponsors, etc.
- Paginated archives for custom post types
- Genernally improved a11y

Things learned implementing the new WordCamp theme





- Don't put too much into the theme
- Focus on good structure, usability and a11y, not design
- Add options to allow visualisation of dynamic contents
- Don't build yet another "Multi-Purpose" theme
- The simpler the styles, the easier to customize/override
- Focus on what you are best at
- Get feedback from your users as soon as possible






- Extend some shortcodes for more flexibility
- Add a custom taxonomy for sessions (level, target ground, language)
- Add starter content (introduced in WordPress 4.7)
- Get more WordCamp organizers involved
- Create multiple style guides for more "layouts"
